FOXES IN BOXES

This is a game for 2-4 players (or teams). Before playing the game revise or pre-teach the vocabulary used in the activity. To do this, you can use question cards as flashcards.

Shuffle question cards and put in a pile face up (answer side down).

Take a turn by flipping a coin: heads = move one space; tails = move two spaces.

When you land on a square with the flower, you take a card from the top of the pile. Look at the picture clue, then say, for example:

There is a fox in the box.

If you are right, don't move.

If you are wrong, move back one space.

The winner is the first player to reach the finish.

Preparation


Print out a game board and question cards. Laminate for future use.
