

# FOXES IN BOXES

*This is a game for 2-4 players (or teams). Before playing the game revise or pre-teach the vocabulary used in the activity. To do this, you can use question cards as flashcards.*

Shuffle question cards and put in a pile face up (answer side down).

Take a turn by flipping a coin:  
heads = move one space; tails = move two spaces.

When you land on a square with the flower, you take a card from the top of the pile. Look at the picture clue, then say, for example:

*There is a fox in the box.*

If you are right, don't move.  
If you are wrong, move back one space.

The winner is the first player to reach the finish.

## Preparation

Print out a game board and question cards.  
Laminate for future use.  
Cut out each pair of cards, fold them and glue to make one double-sided card.



## MATERIALS



a game board



question cards



a coin



a place marker for each player

You can use buttons or pawns as markers.

If you would like to make your own markers, you can use our templates.
