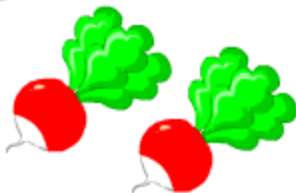

flowers



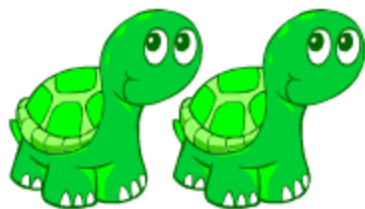
hens

peaches



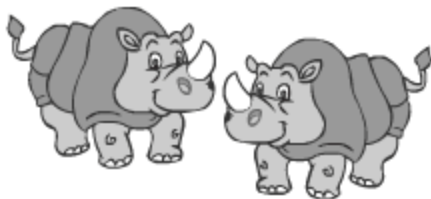

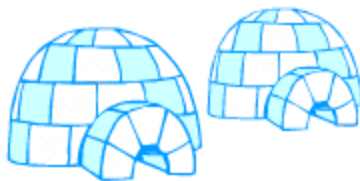

change the final -y to -ies

ending in a vowel + y  
take -s

## nouns ending in- f or -fe



most nouns drop the -f or -fe  
and take -ves

same nouns  
take only -s
